And the winner is: When I was a boy, I wanted to be a racing driver

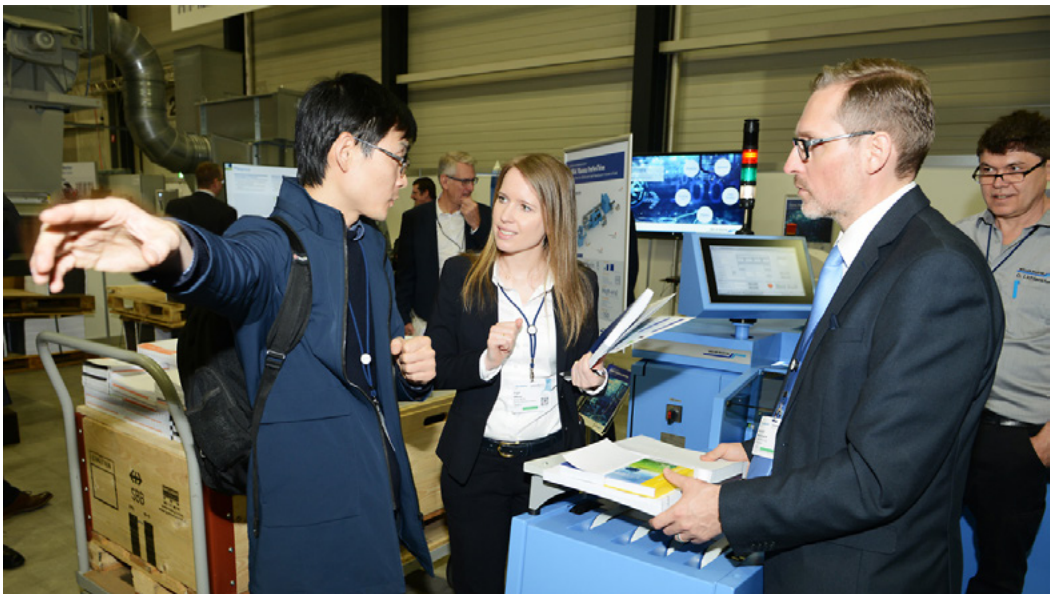
